

## **Zero Waste Beginner's Checklist**

#### Kitchen:

- Plastics Wrap Alternatives: Abeego Bees Wrap
- Plastic Bag/Ziploc Alternatives: Stasher ChicoBag Snack Taxi
- **Sponge Alternatives:** Skoy Cloths Clean Sponge
- Reusable Bag Sealer
- Reusable Napkins
- Reusable To Go Containers, Straws and Utensils: Made of metal and glass

## Food Shopping:

- Mason Jars and Tares for Weight: Don't pay for container weight!
- Reusable Produce and Bread Bags: Buy or make your own
- **Reuse Jars from Non-Zero Waste Shopping:** Use what you have
- Bulk Food and Spice: Buy what you need in your container, no packaging =
  cheaper priced food. Spices at Basil Bandwagon: Clinton/Flemington locations.
  Grinding your peanut butter in your own jar is fresher and try new flavors easily.
- **Bulk Coffee:** WFM or Fresh Market = Whole bean or grind your own coffee. Use your own container or store paper bag, which you can reuse or recycle.
- **Bulk Tea:** Teavana (all locations closing) or Basil Bandwagon: Clinton/Flemington
- Milk in Glass Bottles: Cow milk in glass with bottle deposit, WFM and Shoprite
- Opt for Paper/Cardboard in Packaged Foods: Avoid plastic wrapped

#### **Bathroom:**

- **Safety Razor:** All metal razor holder plus paper wrapped razors
- Create Your Own Shaving Lotion: Aloe Vera and liquid coconut oil
- Nearly Plastic Free Floss: Glass or paper container for floss
- **Bamboo Toothbrush:** Beware of plastic wrapped sustainable products
- **Reusable Tissues:** Make your own from any material or thrift store
- Make Your Own Bathroom Spray: Your favorite essential oils + water
- Lunette Menstrual Cup: Reusable for years with proper care



## Office:

- Return Address Rubber Stamper or Embosser: Avoid sticker labels
- **Staple-less Stapler:** Punches up to 3 pages together without metal staples
- Traditional or Little Free Library: LFL at 84 Mountain Ave., Summit
- **Unsubscribe from Direct Mail Lists:** Contact solicitor directly or request from Data and Marketing Association (www.dmachoice.org)
- Opt for Digital Versions: Newspapers, magazines, and bills available online
